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Pedestrian Traffic Signal Removal Study- *Michigan Avenue and Clover Avenue*

The City has completed a pedestrian traffic signal removal study at the intersection of Michigan Avenue and Clover Avenue. During the study, the City monitored the intersection for accidents and received public comment. Since the study began in July there have been no accidents at the intersection. Based on public support and lack of accidents at the intersection, the City will remove the pedestrian traffic signals. Clover Avenue will continue to stop for Michigan Avenue.

Drivers using the intersection are urged to pay attention to pedestrian and stop for pedestrians in the crosswalk. The City of Rockford plans to continue studying signalized intersections that may no longer warranted traffic signals due to changing traffic patterns throughout the City. Removal of unwarranted signals improves traffic flow along the corridor and saves the City money on signal maintenance.
